

## Alejo Pérez, Conductor

## **Biography**

As a conductor, Alejo Pérez possesses an inherent stylistic awareness and the ability to bring every detail of the most complex score to life. This has consistently secured him a firm place on the international opera and concert scene.

In recent years, the conductor has appeared to great acclaim at the Salzburg Festival (*Faust, Werther*)), at the Semperoper Dresden, Teatro Colón (*Parsifal, Der Rosenkavalier, Ariadne auf Naxos*), and the Lyric Opera of Chicago. In 2022/23, he made his debut at the New National Theatre Tokyo with *Tannhäuser* and continued his collaboration with Grand Théâtre de Genève and Calixto Bieito for a new production of *Lady Macbeth of the Mtsensk District*, following *War and Peace* in September 2021. The season 2023/24 sees him as a guest for new productions of *Katya Kabanova* (staging: Calixto Bieito) at the Semperoper Dresden, of Henze's *Gogo no eiko* (Amon Miyamoto) at the Tokyo Nikikai Opera, and of *The Nightingale and other fables* (Robert Lepage) at the Adelaide Festival.

In his role as music director, Alejo Pérez has been forming the sonic identity of the Flemish Opera since September 2019 - a theatre which has received much international recognition in recent years. There, he made strong appearances in new productions including *Pelléas et Mélisande* (Marina Abramovich, Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui), *Lohengrin* (David Alden), *Don Carlos* (Johan Simons), and *Tristan and Isolde* (Philippe Grandrieux). He will kick off the Flemish season 2023/24 with *La Clemenza di Tito* (Milo Rau) and conclude it with *Jenůfa* (Robert Carsen). He will further be at the rostrum of the Opera Vlaanderen's Symphonic Orchestra for concert highlights such as Fauré's Requiem and Beethoven's Symphony No. 9, as well as for *Petrouchka/The Seven Deadly Sins* with the Ballet Vlaanderen.

Alejo Pérez has been a guest with numerous internationally renowned orchestras, such as Orchestre Philharmonique de Radio France, Tokyo Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra, Yomiuri Nippon Symphony Orchestra, Philharmonia Orchestra, Orchestre de la Suisse Romande, Seoul Philharmonic Orchestra, SWR Symphony Orchestra, NDR Symphony Orchestra, Gürzenich Orchestra Cologne, Deutsches Symphonie-Orchester Berlin, Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie Bremen and Ensemble Intercontemporain. He also enjoys longstanding working relationships with the Stuttgart Opera (Cherubini's Medea, The Love for Three Oranges, Werther); Opéra de Lyon (Pelléas et Mélisande, The Stigmatized, GerMANIA, From the House of the Dead), and the Teatro dell'Opera di Roma (La Cenerentola, The Nose, Lulu, The Fiery Angel). In addition, engagements have taken him to the Tokyo Nikikai Opera, Opéra de Bastille, the Cologne, Frankfurt, and Leipzig Operas, Norwegian National Opera, Teatr Wielki Warsaw, and La Monnaie de Munt.

Between 2009 and 2012 Alejo Pérez served as music director of the Teatro Argentino de La Plata, to which he brought a new lease of life with internationally acclaimed performances. From 2010, he was one of the main conductors at the Teatro Real Madrid in the era of Gerard Mortier, closely working with the Orquesta Sinfónica de Madrid for concerts with Plácido Domingo, Eva-Maria Westbroek, and Ian Bostridge, and celebrated productions of *Rienzi, Don Giovanni, Death in Venice*, Golijov's *Ainadamar*, and Rihm's *Die Eroberung von Mexico*.

The polyglot Argentinian studied both composition and conducting in addition to piano in his native Buenos Aires, and later in Karlsruhe with Peter Eötvös. Formative periods at the start of his conducting career included assisting Peter Eötvös, Michael Gielen, as well as Christoph von Dohnányi at the NDR Symphony Orchestra. In 2019, Alejo Pérez was awarded the Konex Platinum Award for his artistic achievements – one of the highest honours in his home country Argentina.
